Within the MA, leaders must inspire a culture of meticulousness and thoroughness, emphasizing the importance of proper planning, execution, and evaluation

in all aspects of military activities (Ministry of Defence Malaysia, 2010). For instance, in planning a joint military exercise with allied forces, the MA meticulously reviews logistical requirements, coordinates communication protocols, and conducts thorough risk assessments. Attention to detail ensures that every aspect of the exercise is carefully planned and executed, minimising errors and maximising training effectiveness. By paying attention to detail, the MA can minimise risks, optimise resources, and enhance the overall effectiveness of its operations (Bennis, 2009).

Third, Unity of Command is a foundational principle of military organization that is essential for maintaining coherence, coordination, and effectiveness within the MA. Clear lines of authority and responsibility are critical for ensuring that orders are communicated effectively and executed efficiently across all levels of the organisation (Yukl, 2006). In the context of the MA, unity of command is vital for ensuring that operational objectives are pursued cohesively and that resources are utilised in a synchronised manner (Ministry of Defence Malaysia, 2010). For example, during a joint operation involving multiple branches of the MA, a single commander is designated to oversee the entire operation. By adhering to the principle of unity of command, the MA can minimise confusion, prevent duplication of effort, and maximize the impact of its activities in support of national security objectives (Burns, 2012).

Next, Zero Defect is a mindset that emphasis the pursuit of excellence, professionalism, and continuous improvement in all aspects of military operations (Northouse, 2018). In the context of the MA, zero defect is crucial for maintaining the high standards of

performance and readiness required to meet the diverse and evolving security challenges facing Malaysia (Ministry of Defence Malaysia, 2019). Military leaders must cultivate a culture of accountability, discipline, and self-assessment, where personnel are encouraged to identify and rectify deficiencies promptly (Yukl & Mahsud, 2010). For instance, in maintaining military equipment, the MA adheres to a zero defect approach by conducting regular inspections, preventive maintenance, and quality control measures. Any defects or deficiencies are promptly identified and addressed to ensure optimal performance and reliability of equipment during operations. By embracing a zero-defect mentality, the MA can enhance its operational effectiveness, minimise risks, and uphold its reputation as a professional and capable military force (Podsakoff, MacKenzie & Bommer, 1996).

Finally, Integrity is a core value that develop trust, credibility, and ethical conduct within the MA. Military leaders must demonstrate honesty, transparency, and moral courage in their actions and decisions, earning the trust and respect of their subordinates, peers, and superiors (Gioia & Sims, 1986). In the context of the MA, integrity is essential for upholding the rule of law, respecting human rights, and maintaining public confidence in the military (Ministry of Defence Malaysia, 2019). Leaders must lead by example, ensuring that their behavior aligns with the values and principles of the profession of arms (Bass & Riggio, 2006). For example, when faced with a corruption allegation within the ranks, the MA demonstrates integrity by conducting a transparent investigation and holding accountable those found guilty of misconduct. Upholding the principles of honesty and accountability strengthens trust and confidence in the MA's leadership and reinforces its commitment to ethical conduct. By prioritising integrity, the MA can strengthen its institutional integrity, enhance its reputation, and fulfil its mission with honour and distinction (House & Aditya, 1997).

Above all, the F.A.U.Z.I acronyms comprising Focus, Attention to Detail, Unity of Command, Zero Defect and Integrity provides a structured and comprehensive approach to military leadership and management that is highly relevant to the MA. Integrity is very important in decision-making, requiring leaders to uphold ethical standards, prioritise the welfare of personnel, and maintain transparency and accountability throughout the planning and execution process.

As well as training and readiness preparing MA for the war, leaders must maintain focus on developing the skills, capabilities, and readiness levels necessary to accomplish mission objectives (Hogan & Kaiser, 2005). Attention to detail is crucial in the design and conduct of training exercises, where realistic scenarios, thorough debriefings, and constructive feedback are essential for maximising learning and performance improvement. Unity of command ensures effective leadership and supervision during training activities, enabling clear communication, coordination, and synchronisation of efforts to achieve training objectives. Leaders must strive for zero defects in training, emphasising safety,

adherence to standards, and continuous evaluation and refinement of training programs to enhance effectiveness and readiness. Integrity is vital in fostering a culture of professionalism, discipline, and accountability within the unit, where leaders lead by example and uphold the values and standards of the profession of arms.

In term of personnel management and development in managing MA personnel, leaders must maintain focus on developing the capabilities, morale, and well-being of their teams to achieve mission success. Attention to detail is critical in personnel management, where thorough assessment, feedback, and mentorship are essential for identifying strengths, addressing weaknesses, and maximizing individual and collective potential. Unity of command ensures clarity of roles, responsibilities, and expectations, enabling effective supervision, guidance, and support for personnel development. Leaders must strive for zero defects in personnel management, emphasizing fairness, equity, and consistency in policies, procedures, and decision-making to promote morale, cohesion, and trust within the unit. Integrity is paramount in leadership behavior, requiring leaders to demonstrate honesty, integrity, and respect for the dignity and rights of all personnel, fostering a culture of trust, loyalty, and mutual respect within the organization.
